
1st Quarter Highlights


Completed significant staff retraining on animal intake, kennel/cage cleaning and other shelter operations in an effort to improve animal and staff welfare. Implementation of the InTime employee time management system; partnered with 2 Petsmart locations in Milwaukee, WI for offsite adoptions of cats and kittens as an initiative to decrease euthanasia; Staff and volunteers working together to get all dogs outside for exercise. Eliminated the 4 day stray hold policy on stray cats in effort to move cats to adoption faster and implemented adoption hold deposits(open selection) on dogs while on stray hold to reduce length of stay and incidences of common shelter illnesses. Eliminated FIV/Felv testing on most cats due to high cost/low instances of positive results. Participated in several adoption events including PetSmart National Adoption Days, Bissell Adoption Event and held several WCAS Shelter clearing events. Provided shelter tours and presentations to Girl Scout Troop 2216, Sheriffs Dept. Explorers Program and the

Remodel to large kennel room that will include double sided cages for dogs; Sgt. Borrett will be speaking at a collaboratice 911 centers tele-communication class on duties and responsibilities of animal control officers; Purchased 2019 Rabies tags from PetHub, an alternative to the traditional tag registration-pet owner registers tag number online, resulting in the pet being reunited with their family more quickly and without coming in to the shelter.




