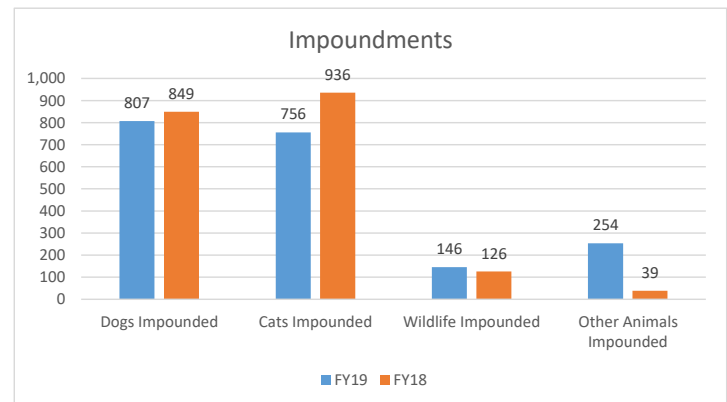
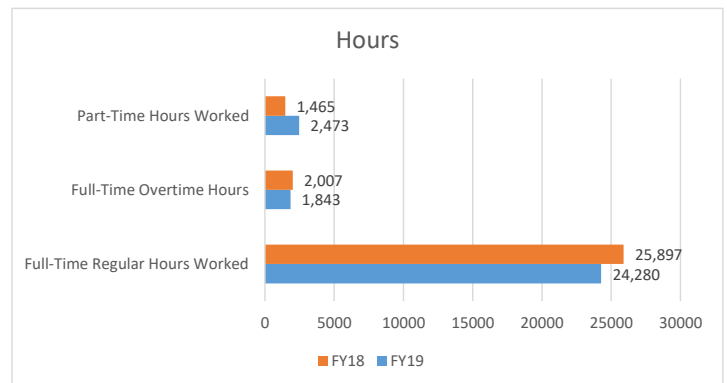
### 2nd Quarter Highlights

Media announcement of increase in life-saving practices at WCAS- 26% increase in dog adoptions; 47% increase in cat adoptions and 58% decrease in dog euthanasia; 64% decrease in cat euthanasia. Hosted tours at WCAS for Barbour School and Patriot's Gateway. Participated in the February PetSmart Adoption Event and attended a Career Day at North Boone Middle School. WCAS was a location for a microchip clinic held by Care for Pets.

### 3rd Quarter Preview

Participating in Bissell Pet Foundation's Clear the Shelters adoption event May 4th. Two Animal Control Officers attended Essential Animal Control training seminar in Elgin, IL. Renovation of the large dog kennel creating double sided housing for all dogs improving the health and mental welfare for the dogs housed in that room as well as creating a safer, more efficient work environment for the employees. As we will be entering kitten season and an increase of animals potentially entering the shelter during the upcoming busy months, we will be continuing our efforts to keep length of stay down, keeping the animal population moving thru adoption, rescue transfer and foster homes. Partnering with Care For Pets on June 1st for a Pet Health Fair for Winnebago County pet owners. WCAS Officer attended a Career Day at Winnebago Middle School.

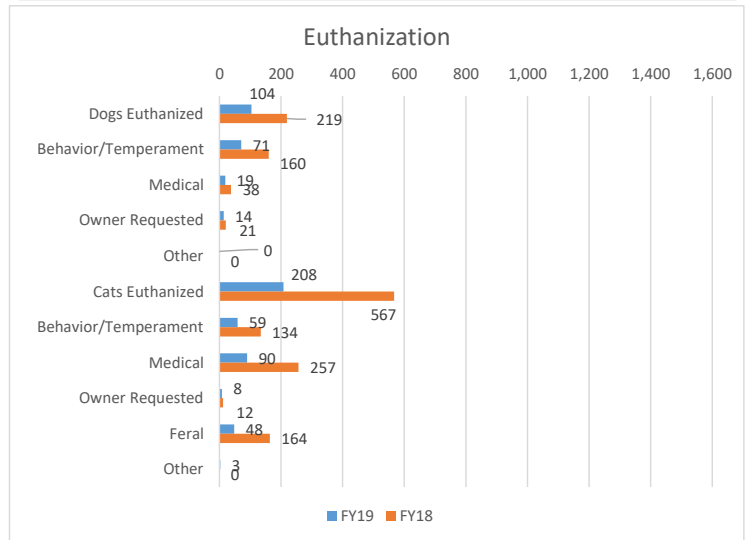
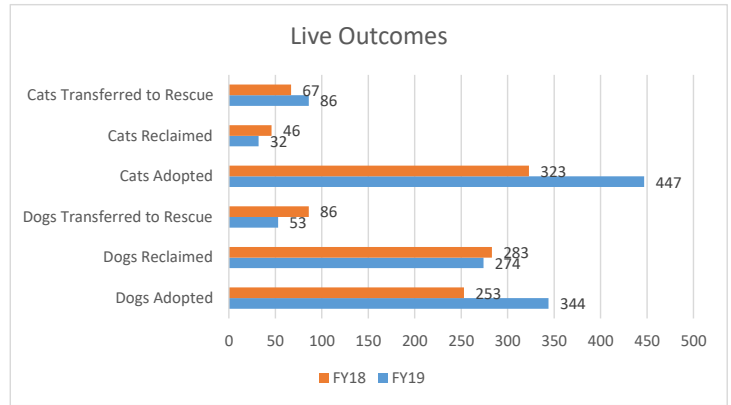
